Vivid colors that shine quietly. A sensitively chosen range of colors unites the designer rugs by RÄKKI RUGS.

On the occasion of *3daysofdesign*, the new rug label RÄKKI RUGS from Berlin is presenting a distinctive range of high-end, hand-knotted rugs from Nepal at Pakhus 11, Dampfærgevej 2, 2100 Copenhagen.

The exhibition of RÄKKI RUGS takes place at the curated show *Design / Dialogue* by the Danish renowned interior magazine *Ark Journal*. The focus of this exhibition is to promote high-quality design and to show new products in an inspiring and relevant way. *Design / Dialogue* is located in an historical setting, nestled alongside one of the city's canals. The old warehouses offer an exceptional ambiance situated close to the center of Copenhagen.

Rebekka Stange is the designer and founder of RÄKKI RUGS. She founded her label in 2022, with which she succeeds in a special way the interplay of subtle color composition, material, and design.

Since her studies of costume design at the University of the Arts in Berlin with Prof. Florence von Gerkan, she constantly works at the interface between textile, space and color.

The cultural background and the connection of different cultures to textile representation have always been an important part of her work. The question of tradition and today's approach to past roots are also part of the artistic exploration for her work and engagement with carpets.

Most of the designs are created in watercolor and the color composition results in the finest luminosity. These pictures that seem so calm are the result of an intensive, moved process of painting whose intensity is through insistence and patience. By combining individual color schemes and carefully processed natural materials, Rebekka Stange creates unique and timeless rugs that already look like classics.

The interaction and proportion, material and color composition makes RÄKKI RUGS distinctive.

„With RÄKKI RUGS I like to revive the art of the rug and create a timeless aesthetic in subtle color, which gives us strength and peace in everyday life. I know of no greater joy in life with objects than when a special work of art becomes part of our everyday lives.“, says Rebekka Stange.

RÄKKI RUGS only uses fine Tibetan highland wool, Nepalese nettle and Chinese silk.

The combination of the traditional Tibetan loop knot and the use of natural different materials gives the rugs a special feel with an elegant sheen. All used materials are dyed manually, which brings a irregular structure in the grain and creates a variety of color nuances that subsequently bring a special liveliness in the rug.

The natural fibres are carded and spun by hand, making the texture of each rug entirely unique and thus emphasizes the natural vibrancy.

RÄKKI RUGS creations are produced in close cooperation with their manufacture in Kathmandu, Nepal.

Sustainability and fair working conditions are guiding principles of the quality assessment of the rugs for the demanding label. Responsible design projects at RÄKKI RUGS are about pausing and considering every step so that every decision we make enables a more sustainable and regenerative approach to design.

In addition to standard sizes, RÄKKI RUGS also offers custom-made rugs that are tailored to your exact size requirements. With this service, you can choose the dimensions that fit your room perfectly so that your rug blends seamlessly into your space. Whether you need a small, square rug for a cozy corner or a large rug as an eye-catcher for an entire room, these custom rugs offer a tailored solution for your exact needs.
